## **This funding will be used to**

- Improve Literacy and Numeracy benchmarks for students in Prep-Year 3 with an 85% increase in end of year targets
- Ensure every student accessing a different year level curriculum (Individual Learning Plan, Support Plan or Educational Support Plan) will achieve a "C" standard or better against the relevant year level achievement standard
- Improve the teaching and learning of writing for all students to have a minimum of 90% of students at or above Regional benchmarks and at or above NMS in NAPLAN for Years 3 & 5.
- Engage in extension activities with U2B students in Years 3-6 by utilising programs from the IMPACT centre

## **Our initiatives include**

- Targeted and focussed teaching, learning and individualised support in the Early Years to improve student outcomes
- Early Years transition program
- Engage in professional development to support pedagogy, teaching and learning
- Provide intensive support for students who are below or above regional benchmarks and NMS in Literacy and Numeracy

## **Our school will improve student outcomes by**

- Employing additional teacher aides to assist with the delivery of literacy and numeracy programs (including intensive support for identified students who did not meet minimal standards in 2021) (I4S - \$17000)
- Funding teaching staff to attend professional development (I4S - \$2207, School Budget \$5000)
- STEM – IMPACT centre for students in U2B (School Funded \$1500)
